INDIVIDUAL PIECES OF CURLING EQUIPMENT

ROCK or STONE A polished circular piece of granite that weighs about 42 pounds, eight rocks per

team per end are delivered.

BROOM Used for sweeping which makes the rock go farther and curl less. Newer

brooms have aluminum, fiberglass or graphite fiber handles with a nylon sweeping surface. Always have the broom lead you down the ice as you sweep so you can see the

rocks in play.

SLIDER A Teflon surface worn on the sliding foot during delivery.

GRIPPER A rubber cover worn over the sliding foot when not delivering a stone to prevent

slipping on the ice.

STICK An alternate rock delivery tool used by curlers unable to deliver in the traditional

sliding style.
